<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Problem gambling is the spectrum of all gambling behavior patterns that compromise, disrupt or damage personal, family or vocational pursuits. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gambling problems are often hidden, and many people may not be aware of them.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It can result in financial ruin, legal problems, loss of career and family, or In extreme cases, even suicide. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One person's gambling addiction may also lead to negative consequences for loved ones and concerned others.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nationally between 1% and 3% of the general adult (18+) population, or over 5.1 million people, experience a gambling problem every year. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gambling problems often occur alongside other problems such as alcohol disorder, and substance abuse.

Can children and teenagers develop gambling problems?

According to the National Council on Problem Gambling, children and teens are at higher risk than adults for developing a gambling problem. Additionally, individuals who start gambling at a young age are also more likely to develop a gambling addiction later in life.
